It's no secret that Christian City is a unique place to call home! For folks who have retired to our 500-acre campus, it offers a safe, affordable, and friendly place to live. Christian City is not just a retirement community. It was founded almost 60 years ago as a refuge for children without

homes or families.

Over those six decades, it has grown into the amazing organization you see today: a campus filled with life and love, offering community and support to vulnerable youth and families as well as to those over 62, disabled, or in need of rehab services.

A sense of community is a key hallmark of life at Christian City. Among the many ways to participate on campus is our volunteer program which offers residents the opportunity to become engaged in meaningful ways. About 80% of all volunteers at Christian City are residents, including retirees and our

youth. They man welcome desks and help with administrative tasks, keep Graceland stocked and ready for customers, help put on special events across campus, and support the Chaplain's office.

Volunteering is good for you. Research shows that volunteers over 55 years old report decreases in anxiety and depression, loneliness, and social isolation. They also report enhanced physical capacity and higher life satisfaction.

Staff across our campus know that Christian City couldn't do all that we do as a community without our volunteers. April is Volunteer Appreciation Month, and it is a good time to not only thank those who give their time to make our community a better place, but also for those who aren't volunteering to consider if they might like to.
