



Thrive Program and Foster Care Tax Credit Disclosure

Christian City, Inc. is a DFCS Qualified Foster Child Support Organization (QFCSO) working with other DFCS Qualified Foster Child Support Organizations, eligible aging out foster youth as well as individual and business taxpayers to assist with the tax credit application process.

Thanks to the Fostering Success Tax Credit, through its Thrive program, Christian City provides housing, counseling, life skills development, therapy, and career development services to young adults transitioning out of foster care as they define and pursue their education and career dreams. Our goal is to prepare them to live independently and obtain a job that will pay a living wage. In fact, each of our young adults earns a certification in a career or trade. At their graduation from the program, they have learned to manage their personal budgets, they have saved a nest egg, and are prepared to live independently, while receiving post-care services from Christian City to help them on their path.

The Fostering Success Act Tax Credit launched in 2023, and the donations made to Christian City were made in the last few months of the calendar year. Therefore, \$334,500, the entirety of the funds received in 2023, was carried forward into the calendar year 2024. In 2024, Christian City invested \$224,166 in the lives of 51 qualified young adults over the course of the year. Later that year, we received an additional \$703,000 in contributions through the tax credit. The balance of these funds at the end of 2024 totaled \$818,334.

Christian City is engaged in a capital campaign that will expand our capacity for serving our Thrive program from housing 17 young adults at a time to housing up to 49 at a time. Any unused funds donated through the tax credit program are carried over to provide services to the larger population when we complete construction on the additional town homes.
