



Chronic Disease Self-Management Program

Feel better. Be in control. Do the things you want to do.

Join this 6-week evidence-based program to help you gain control over your health and improve your quality of life. Must have internet access and be comfortable with Zoom classes. This is a free program provided by a federal grant through the Administration for Community Living. Class begins September 16!

Topics covered include:

- Making weekly action plans, sharing experiences, and helping each other solve problems they encounter in creating and carrying out their self-management program
- Decision-making and problem-solving skills
- Techniques to deal with emotional problems such as frustration, stress, fatique, isolation
- Fatigue and sleep management
- Management of pain
- · Developing an appropriate exercise plan for maintaining and improving strength
- Appropriate use of medications
- Communicating effectively with family, friends and health professionals
- Nutrition and healthy eating
- How to evaluate and make informed treatment decisions
