

Janice Turber



Many residents come to Christian City with the simple goal of enjoying retirement. Janice Turber came for that and much more.

While looking to downsize, Janice and her husband Bob found Christian City and fell in love with its inter-generational community. For Janice, the decision to move here felt deeper than convenience or timing.

"It felt like we were being led here so I could work at the Children's Village," she said.

After spending four decades walking alongside individuals, couples, and families through life's hardest moments, many connected to the foster care system, Janice, an LPC (licensed professional counselor), felt ready for a change of pace, but not a cessation of her work.

That sense of purpose would come full circle during a chance conversation with former Chief Operating Officer George Martin. When Janice shared her background as a therapist, his response was simple. "We need you now."

At 75, Janice spends three days a week counseling children and young adults across Christian City programs. Her office, stocked with snacks and encouragement cards, has become a haven for clients navigating some of the most difficult seasons of their young lives.

Janice's care often extends beyond her office walls. She loves to cook meals for the youth she serves, explaining simply, "If you care about people, you feed them."

That same spirit of consistency and care shapes the way Janice approaches her work as a therapist. In addition to practicing trauma-informed care, she teaches life lessons rooted in respect, decision-making and emotional regulation.

Over time, she has witnessed remarkable transformations. Youth who arrived angry and guarded often leave softened, no longer carrying the full weight of their past alone. Others who were initially resistant to talking about their mental health, have graduated from the program finally feeling heard for the first time in their lives.

While her professional credentials, trainings, and experience are extensive, Janice says what she values most in this chapter of her career is something far simpler. "I feel like the Christian City grandma," she said.

With the need as great as ever, Janice has no plans to cut back on her hours spent with her youngest clients.

"Christian City is where I am supposed to be, and this work is what I am supposed to be doing. I will be doing it as long as I can."

Growing with Purpose

Christian City has launched our largest fundraising campaign in two decades — an effort to expand our impact for youth and families in south metro Atlanta.

- Build the Canakaris Early Learning Center for up to 100 children, operated by the YMCA of Metro Atlanta
- Expand our Thrive Program to serve 49 youth aging out of foster care
- Renovate and sustain campus facilities to ensure long-term impact
